

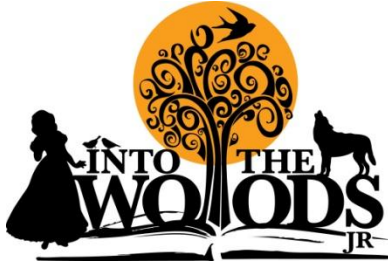

Attention Drama Club Parents

We had our first round of auditions this past week for the musical Into the Woods. The great news is that we had a lot of amazing student auditions! In fact, we had 75 students audition for the show! Unfortunately, however, that is more than we can take. Due to the large amount of students who auditioned, we will have to make cuts. The maximum number of students for the show will be 35. Callbacks will take place on Wednesday, November 1st on the stage right after school to determine the final cast. Your child will be notified through homeroom if he/she is selected for a call back.

There will also be a list posted on the Drama Club Schoology page and outside room A5 as additional places of reference. If your child does not get a spot as a performer in the musical he/she can still be a part of the Drama Club as a member of the back stage crew or help with painting sets etc. For those who are interested in that, they should go see Mrs. Persinger in A5 to get on the list to be informed of backstage crew meetings. We want to thank you for your support of the arts and hope that your child will audition again in the future.

Halloween Costume Guidelines

With Halloween approaching, here are the guidelines if you are planning on wearing a costume to school:

- **Dressing up for Halloween is voluntary.** Students and staff who prefer not to dress up may choose that option.
- Costumes must be in good taste. No references to drugs, alcohol, tobacco, sex or violence will be allowed. Dresses must have at least a 2" strap at the shoulder.
- Students may not have blood displayed on their clothing or makeup.
- Halloween hair dye and makeup must be applied at home. NO hair dye or makeup may be brought to school. Any Halloween hair dye or makeup at school will result in an Administrative Referral to the office.
- Hats may be worn if they are part of a costume. Hats may not be worn if they are not part of a costume.
- Full face masks are not allowed. A mask covering only the area around the eyes is acceptable.
- No weapons or look-alike weapons of any kind may be brought to school. This includes plastic, wooden or other type of sword, dagger, knife, gun, etc. Any look-alike weapon will result in an Administrative Referral to the office.
- On Halloween, the focus for the day is still on learning. While we will have fun dressing up, students are reminded that we will continue to have regular classes and instruction all day long.



Let's have a good time with dressing up. If you have a question about your costume, tell a teacher or administrator what you plan to wear and let them decide if it is appropriate. Remember to keep all costumes in good taste.

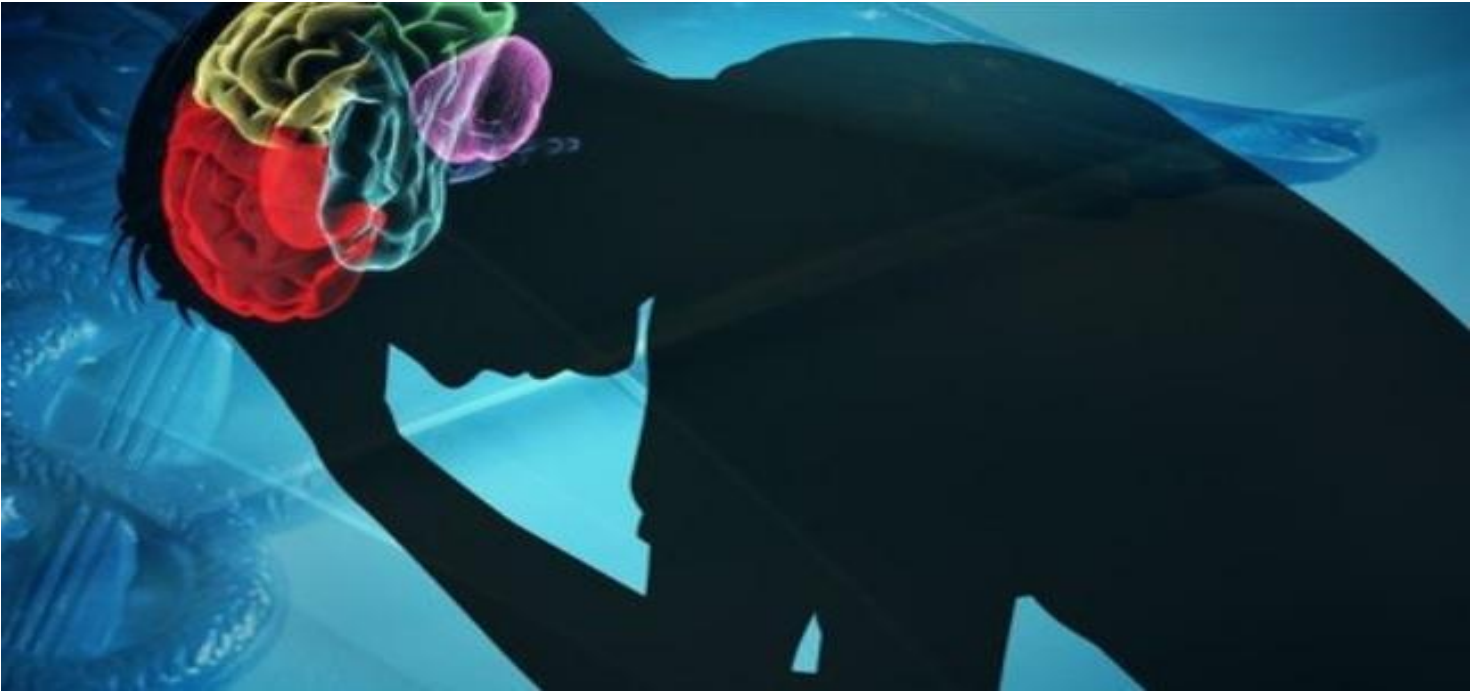
