Student Attendance

This year parents will be receiving a call at 10:30 a.m. for any student absent and not cleared and again at 6:30 p.m. at night. We are doing this to help provide a safe environment and alert parents. If parents call and clear the absence they will not be receiving a call. Call our Attendance office at 916-315-9009, ext. 4105.

Checking your student out during the school day:

If your student needs to leave school at any time during the school day they need to bring a signed note from their parent/guardian before school to the attendance office. They will be issued a slip to be released from class. Students can only be signed out by a parent, guardian, or person listed the Aeries Parent Portal Account and is at least 18 years of age. This policy ensures an uninterrupted learning environment and allows students to be waiting for you in the front office to be signed out.

If you do not send a note/communication to school to receive an early release note it may take time to locate your student due to the different academy rotation schedules. When checking your student into school, your student must go to the attendance window to fill out a slip before going into class.

Driving Caution during Drop Off and Pick Up

Please do not stop in the middle of the traffic lane or in the middle of the parking lot to let your student out. Please pull to the curb or into a parking spot. Also, please do not park in the bus loop or block the bus loop driveways; this area needs to be kept clear for buses. Student drop off is not permitted behind the E Wing Building.
