4. Who has the sole power of impeachment (voting to remove someone from office)? (Article I, Section 2)
5. What is the length of term of office for members of the United States Senate? (Article I, Section 3)
6. How old must one be to be elected to the United States Senate? (Article I, Section 3)
7. Who must approve people – like ambassadors, judges, and cabinet members – that the president appoints to government positions? (Article II, Section 2)
8. Who must approve any treaties that are made with foreign countries? (Article II, Section 2)
9. Who has the sole power to try (bring to trial) all impeachments? (Article I, Section 3)
10. Who has legislative (law-making) powers? (Article I, Section 1)
11. Who has the power to declare war? (Article I, Section 8)
12. What can the legislative branch do if the president vetoes a bill? (Article I, Section 7)
13. Who has the power to propose amendments to the Constitution of the United States? (Article V)
14. What is the length of a term of office for the president of the United States? (Article II, Section 1)
15. How old must one be to be elected president of the United States? (Article II, Section 1)
16. Who has the power to approve or veto laws? (Article I, Section 7)
17. Who has the power to make treaties with foreign governments? (Article II, Section 2)
18. Who has the power to nominate judges to the Supreme Court? (Article II, Section 2)

19. Who has the power to nominate ambassadors, judges, or other officers of the United States – such as members of the Cabinet? (Article II, Section 2)

20. Who is Commander-in-Chief of U.S. military forces? (Article II, Section 2)

21. What is the length of term for the Justices of the United States Supreme Court? (Article III, Section 1)

22. Who has the power to review all laws and treaties of the United States? (Article III, Section 2)

23. Who has the power to settle disputes involving the United States? (Article III, Section 2)

24. Who has the power to settle disputes between different states? (Article III, Section 2)

25. Who presides over any impeachment trial of the president of the United States? (Article I, Section 3)
