FROM THE ARTICLES TO THE CONSTITUTION

There were many factors that led to the abandonment of the Articles at the Constitutional Convention

The Not-So-United States

- 1. Many states claimed land in the Northwest Territory
- 2. States were charging other states to pass goods over their borders
- 3. States issued their own money which was worthless and which other states would not accept



Poor Foreign Relations

- 1. Britain closed the profitable West Indies trade to the U.S.
- 2. Spain claimed U.S. land the Mississippi River
- 3. France demanded repayment of money loaned during the Revolutionary War

Shays' Rebellion

- Falling crop prices left farmers poor and unable to pay for their farms
- Massachusetts government refused to help;
 raised taxes even more
- First armed revolt since the Revolutionary War





The Result of all This:

Many Americans worried about the United States government's ability to maintain order

James Madison and Alexander Hamilton persuaded the Confederation Congress to consider revising the Articles




States were invited to a special convention at which the Articles would be revised



The Result of all This:


- Delegates from 12 states met at Independence Hall in Philadelphia, PA
 - Rhode Island did not come
 - 55 delegates came







The Result of all This



- After discussion, delegates agreed to abandon the
 Articles and create a new constitution
 - Delegates worked on it from May to September 1787
 - New Constitution was signed on Sept. 17th 1787
 - Did not go into effect until July 2, 1788 when New Hampshire became the ninth state to ratify it
