A political party that wanted to preserve the power of state governments. It was most popular in the South and along the western frontier. Leaders included Thomas Jefferson, James Madison, and Aaron Burr.	French foreign minister who refused to meet with U.S. diplomats and masterminded the bribe and loan scandal later known as the XYZ affair.
Laws passed by a Federalist-dominated Congress aimed at protecting the government from treasonous ideas, actions and people. It was used against Republicans.	Monarch of France who was beheaded by overzealous revolutionaries during the French Revolution.
Leading Federalist who served as the second president of the U.S. but lost to Thomas Jefferson in the election of 1800.	An amendment to the Constitution which created a separate ballot for president and vice president. Added to the Constitution because of the rivalry between political parties.
Incident in which French agents attempted to get a bribe and loans from U.S. diplomats in exchange for an agreement that French privateers would no longer attack American ships; it led to an undeclared naval war between the two countries.	Agreement between the U.S. and Spain that changed Florida's border and made it easier for American ships to use the port of New Orleans.
