Figure Stating

One characteristic of Pony's writing style is the inclusion of many figures of speech, especially similes and *metaphors* when he is making comparisons.

A simile uses the words "as" or "like" to compare things. "The cat was as black as the dark side of the moon" is an example of a simile. Here the blackness of the cat is compared to the color of the dark side of the moon.

A comparison also may be merely suggested through *metaphor*. A metaphor does not use the words "as" or "like." "Chris covered his plate with a mountain of mashed potatoes" is an example of metaphor. Here the heap of potatoes is compared to a mountain.
