Isaac Bashevis Singer/ a writer who won a Nobel Prize He's a poor peasant who lives with his wife & 3 daughters in a one room hut far from the village with no luxuries The luxury they have is that they own a dog and a cat

Jan is a kind, considerate, and loving person

The dog Burek acts like a cat and the cat Kot acts like a dog; they think they are the same type of animal

He is a traveling salesman who has all kinds of trinkets to sell and a mirror

A mirror with a wooden frame that shows their reflection

Marianna offers 5 groshen a month for the mirror

Marianna was missing a tooth; one daughter's nose was too snub and too broad; another daughter's chin was too narrow and too long; third daughter's face had freckles; Jan's lips were too thick and teeth protruded like a buck's "For the first time the Skiba family deeply felt its poverty and envied the rich."

The conflict is that the Skiba's were perfectly happy with their way of life until they got the mirror and looked at themselves discovering their physical imperfections They both noticed that they were not the same kind of animal and turned on one another injuring each other

When Jan returns the mirror to the peddler for other items When the family goes back to not caring about their looks Jan Skiba is the main character due to his family role The mirror is the antagonist because of the problem Discovering that it is important to be/accept yourself
