- 1. Start up: Pull out your "Poetry Record Sheet" for checking. Then Pull out your planner and Quietly write down the week's assignments from the flip chart (or internet if absent).
 - a. Get this week's vocab "Spect" and complete part A Quietly
- 2. Review: What was the point of "The Man in the Glass?" Connection to our Theme?
- 3. Introduce and discuss Nikki Giovanni's poem "Winter" twice on pg 714 of your Literature book, decide what each stanza means, why the poem is on such a simple topic, and look up what a Lyrical poem is. Then write out a 2-3 sentence summary of what the poem means, a 2-3 sentence explanation of how it relates to "Choices and Consequences," and add the poem to your Poetry Record Sheet
 - a. Discuss the poem and add to the "Poetry Record Sheet"
- 4. <u>Homework: Complete all Parts of the Poetry Record sheet for "Winter" and Part B of vocab</u> Spect, for Tues. 11/4(Remember vocab Test Fri.)

TUESDAY

- 1. Start Up: Pull out your Part "B" of Vocab "Spect" and your "Poetry Record Sheet" for checking, quietly sign up for group roles, and pull out Lit. Terms for today's discussion
 - a. Collect one sheet of paper per group with each person's first and last name and roles
- 2. Review: What was "Winter" about? Connection to our theme?
- 3. Introduce and discuss William Stafford's poem "Trying to Tell It," read it out loud, decide what each stanza means, then write a 2-3 sentence summary explaining what the poem means and a 2-3 sentence explanation of how the poem relates to "Choices & Consequences." Then add the poem to your Poetry Record Sheet
 - a. Compare the Poems "Winter" and "Trying to Tell it." What do these poems have in common and what makes them different? Come up with at least 3 similarities and 3 differences in your groups to discuss as a whole class (if absent, do this on your own paper and turn in)-Make a Venn Diagram
- 4. <u>Homework: Finish adding "Trying to Tell It" to the Poetry Record Sheet, and Reread Lit Terms</u>

WEDNESDAY/THURSDAY (BLOCK)

- 1. Start Up: Pull out your Literary Terms packets, Poetry Record Sheets, and check your answers
- 2. Review: what are some Prominent Symbols in Literature? What do we need to pay attention to when we read Poetry?
- 3. Introduce Robert Frost, get a copy of his poem, Read, analyze, and go over "The Road Not Taken;" then, add it to the Poetry Record Sheet
- 4. Introduce, read, discuss Kumin's Poem "The Microscope" (pg 365)add to the Poetry Record Sheet
 - a. In groups, come up with at least 5 key similarities and 5 differences for "The Road Not Taken" and "The Microscope" poems on a Venn Diagram, and be ready to share out
- 5. Introduce, read, and discuss Walter de la Mare's poem "Me" on pg 40, answer the questions that follow the poem, and add the poem to your "Poetry Record Sheet"
- 6. Handout Introduce "Quotes and Abbreviations" grammar worksheet to be completed for Fri. 11/8
- 7. <u>Homework: Complete the "Quotes and Abbreviation" grammar handout and study for the 5 word "Spect" vocab test with Part C on flash cards completed for Fri. 11/8</u>

FRIDAY

- 1. Start Up: Pull out your "Poetry Record Sheet," your Grammar Worksheet "Quotes/Abbreviations," and part C of vocab "Spect" for checking. Take the "Spect" vocab test; and, when you are done, quietly correct the grammar sheet from LCD
 - a. Go over the Grammar Worksheet and clarify questions
- 2. Review: What were the poems "Road Not Taken," "Microscope," and "Me" about and how do they relate to our theme?
- 5. Read Eve Merriam's "Thumbprint" on pg. 134, answer the questions that follow the poem, and add the poem to your "Poetry Record Sheet"
- 3. Do a whole class comparison and contrast of the two poems "Me" and "Thumbprint"
