# Mr. Victor LESSON PLANS FOR 10/6—10/10 Room C-1

- Start Up: Pull out you "Idoms" sheet for checking. Quietly pull out your planners and write down this week's assignments from the flip chart (internet if absent). Then get a copy of this week's Vocab "Scrib/Script" and complete parts "A" & "B" for Tues. 10/8
- 2. Review: What was the story "Seventh Grade" about? Conflict? Climax? Point of the story?
- 3. Answer questions about "7<sup>th</sup> Grade," "Idioms.," What did Victor not like to do?
  - a. In groups discuss what kinds of things middle schoolers like to do for 1 minute
- 4. Handout Favorite Activity Packet and Prewriting Sheet and begin the Pre-writing using the Help Sheet
- 5. <u>Homework: Complete the Pre-writing and 1<sup>st</sup> draft of Favorite Activity as well as Part "B" vocab "Scrib/Script" for Tues. 10/7</u>

#### TUESDAY

- 1. Start Up: Pull out Part "B" of Vocab "Scrib/Script" and Favorite Activity paragraph stapled under your pre-writing for checking, then quietly complete part "C" of Vocab for Fri. 10/11
- 2. Review: What are we looking for when we Peer-Edit/PQP?
- 3. Do Best Group/Students of the week
- 4. Pull out your Common Mistake Notes, Peer-Editing/PQPing Packet, Format for the Paragraph, and the Favorite Activity Assignment Packet
  - a. Exchange papers and do a great job editing someone's papers making comments for what works, doesn't work on every sentence and a solid PQP at the end
  - b. Remember, look for the 3 parts, Content and Focus, and Grammar and Mechanics
- 5. When done, work on preparing your close to perfect as possible, typed in Google Docs, saved, printed draft due block day. YOU MUST SUBMIT THIS INTO classroom.google.com before class!!!!!!
- 6. <u>Homework: Completed improved, typed in Google Docs, saved to a flash drive, printed paragraph on</u> "Favorite Activity" is due Weds.—Use your "Format for the Paragraph," "Common Mistake Notes," and the Fav. Activity Assignment Packet to help you perfect your Paragraph due on Block Day

#### WEDNESDAY/THURSDAY (BLOCK)

- 1. **Start Up**: Pull out and staple your typed draft of "Favorite Activity" paragraphs under your pre-writing and 1<sup>st</sup> draft for checking. Then pull out all your Writing Packets
- 2. **Review**: What makes a good, solid, well written paragraph?
- 3. Introduce Group writing concept to produce the best writing of a "Favorite Activity" paragraph (see if a group can write a final draft that can be put into the *Writing Packet*

### a. IF YOU ARE ABSENT, YOU MUST DO ALL OF THE BELOW ON YOUR OWN!

- b. Get a Chromebook, pull out your Goldenrod Directions for logging into "Rocklinusd BYOD."

  Once you have logged in pull up your document so that everyone can read it
- c. Read over each group member's paragraph and, as a group, pick the best one that the group thinks can be turned into an "A" paragraph. **The goal then is to get an "A"**
- d. Together rework the paragraph from Title to CS, using your writing packets and pgs. 5-6, 42-43, 54-56, 58-62, 66, and the purple Rubric, making sure that everything in the paragraph is correct, has all its parts, has clear/concise/specific/showing examples, is free of grammar errors, and answers the questions "Why? And How? in each point. Remember the goal is to get an "A"
- e. Pick a typist and make sure your group has a flash drive. When you are done, save the revised draft to the flash drive to print in class.
- f. Exchange group papers in class, Peer-edit and score as a group.
- g. Once you get your group paper back, work together to fix, change, improve in any way possible checking your resources and then we'll submit to Turn it in. com
- h. Handout Turnitin.com directions, give class codes, passwords, etc. and then work to submit the group paragraph
- 4. For those of you whose paragraph was not picked, take what you learned in the group re-write and make a better second draft to turn in Friday as a final draft
  - a. Make sure that you use the resources you were given along with the free sentences to steal
  - b. You must show change and improvement on your final draft!
  - c. If you are absent, you are responsible for getting your 2<sup>nd</sup> draft Peer-Edited and PQPed, correct your final draft, and submit it to Turnitin.com by Friday morning 10/10
- 5. <u>Homework: Complete part "C" of "Scrib/Script," study for the vocabulary test, and completed/typed/saved final draft of "Favorite Activity," submitted to Turnitin.com all due Fri. 10/10</u>
