- 2. Review: What are the parts to paragraph? What are transitions? Why is the number 3 important?
- 3. Introduce the "Parts of the Essay packet" Highlight a few key areas and discuss
- 4. <u>Homework: Read over the "Parts of the Essay" packet and Complete Part "B" for Tues 1/6/15</u> and "C" for Fri. of vocab "Auto." Remember, Weds. is the last day for extra credit CD

TUESDAY

- 1. Start Up: Pull out and show me part "B" of Vocab, your "Parts of the Essay Packet," and read over the example essays to see what the essay is supposed to look like
- 2. Review: How many parts are there for the essay? What are the major differences?
- 3. Finish going over the "Parts of the Essay" Packet
- 4. Introduce the "1 Thing Important" essay assignment with "Cool Kids" article, handout essay prewriting sheet, and begin your pre-writing and 1st draft of the essay (you must get done with at least half of the essay for tomorrow to get all points—you may complete it if you like, but at least half
 - a. You must finish typing your first draft in Google Classroom by the end of the first period on block day, so plan accordingly. No excuses
- 5. Quick review of Simple/Compound/Complex Sentences w/take home test. Must be 100% correct
- 6. Homework: Remember to work on part "C" of Vocab "Auto," study for the Vocab test on Fri.

WEDNESDAY/THURSDAY (Block)

- 1. Start Up: Pull out your Completed Pre-Writing of "One Thing Important" essay assignment, get a Chromebook, and show me that you are at least half way done with the typing on your Chromebook. Then continue working to finish your 1st draft or work on something else quietly

FRIDAY
