- Use appropriate strategies such as organization and descriptive detail, and your grammar and mechanics.

(Hook) Are people greatly influenced by others? Or is it a matter of genetics? (GDT) Many people have their role models and want to be just like them. Some folks we adore and have a big impact on us. Celebrities like Deborah King said in her article, "The Impact Celebrities Have on Our Lives," seem to influence us, but there are also those possibly non-famous citizens such as parents, grandparents, or friends that do as well. (Thesis) As weird as it sounds, I have set my older brother, Yu, as a major role model in my life because he stays brave during toughest times, he is hardworking, and he can easily prove people who underestimate him wrong.

(TS) To begin with, I idolize my brother's bravery for several reasons. (1<sup>st</sup> Pt.) First, even at the scariest times, my brother went through them fearlessly which made me want to become formidable myself. (Ex.) Yu was brave, but he wasn't very healthy when he was younger. He was a great guy, but had been diagnosed with rare X-linked disease called WAS (Wiskott-Aldrich Syndrome). At the same time, he had extreme asthma which caused him to stop breathing suddenly. He had to dash to the emergency room almost every day and the hospital charged money every time. It was hard for him, but he remained dauntless during his multiple operations. (Ex.) My brother emigrated from China so he didn't know how to speak very good English. He felt uncomfortable being in a place where there was no one like him, and he did not enjoy being teased. (TS) In addition, my diligent brother has impacted me with his determination and technological skills. (1<sup>st</sup> Pt.) To start with, Yu used to be very lazy, but he's put on a hardworking attitude and has become extremely smart. (Ex.) My brother works hard, but back when my brother was in middle school, he was always laid-back. This all changed in high school when it came close to the time of year in that the high school took the SAT test. When Yu got his result, he realized that he needed to study a lot more. In Sierra College, he now has over 100% in every single subject, and he always drags me over to see his grades with a happy face. Similar to this example Deborah King stated that there are a lot of stories where some idols made poor choices and broke laws, but there are positive contributions they have done too like help feed and take care of the poor (par 15). (1<sup>st</sup> Pt) <u>One</u>, my brother may look short, but he a very athletic person. (Ex.) People think that my brother is not very strong, but they are wrong. Yu was once challenged to jump over the hurdles in PE. He leaped over the short hurdles easily, and he was then told to do the highest hurdles. He did them while all the other taller people couldn't.
