### BOOK MLA Citation

Example: Kent, Zachary and Susan Marie Dean. *George Washington*. Chicago: Children's Press, 1986. Print.

**AUTHOR** (last name-comma-first and middle) \_\_\_\_\_ (period).

**TITLE** (*italicized*) \_\_\_\_\_ (period).

**PLACE** of publication \_\_\_\_\_ (colon):

**PUBLISHER** \_\_\_\_\_ (comma), **YEAR** \_\_\_\_ (period). Print.

### ENCYCLOPEDIA MLA Citation

Example: Barnes, Jr., Dr. Isaac Jacob. "Washington, George." *The World Book Encyclopedia*. 2000 ed. Print.

**AUTHOR** *if available* (last name, first and middle) \_\_\_\_\_ (period).

**ARTICLE TITLE** ("quotation marks") \_\_\_\_\_ (period).

**TITLE** of encyclopedia (*italicized*) \_\_\_\_\_ (period).

**YEAR** \_\_\_\_\_ ed (period). Print.

### INTERNET MLA Citation

Example: *The Purdue OWL Family of Sites*. The Writing Lab and OWL at Purdue and Purdue U, 2008.  
Web. 23 Apr. 2008.

**EDITOR, AUTHOR, or COMPILER NAME** (if available) \_\_\_\_\_ (period).

**NAME of SITE** (*italicized*) \_\_\_\_\_ (period).

**SPONSOR or PUBLISHER of site** (if available) \_\_\_\_\_ (period).

**DATE** of page creation:(if available) Day Month (abbreviated-period.) Year \_\_\_\_\_ (period).

**MEDIUM of PUBLICATION** \_\_\_\_\_ Web \_\_\_\_\_ (period).

**DATE YOU ACCESSED SITE** Day Month (abbreviated-period.) Year \_\_\_\_\_ (period).
